**Marriage and Family at the Heart of the Parish:**

**Guidelines on Use of Modern Technology when Working with Children: - Use of photography and video**

The use of photography and video is an issue of great concern among those working with children. The Diocese recognises that every parish has their own arrangements in relation to its use in schools, youth groups and for the sacraments however the guidelines have been devised below to aid parishes and diocesan groups:

- It is always good practice to seek *written* permission from a parent or guardian before taking any photographs or video footage of children. This written permission must be sought from the parent/guardian or the person who owns the photograph before it can be displayed on promotional materials or websites. This can be incorporated in the registration form when a child joins a group (template permission Resource 10);
- Neither names nor any personal information should be displayed alongside any photographs;
- Special consideration should be given where taking photographs or video footage might be misinterpreted, or the images could be seen as provocative (e.g. beach trip or gymnastics display etc.). It is not to say, however, that with the right planning, these events cannot be recorded and enjoyed.
- Photography and video recording are important methods of recording social activity and providing an historic record – illustrating and validating important moments in people's lives. This process is a powerful and personal one, and therefore we must respect the rights of all to make the choice whether or not to be photographed.

**This Week's Calendar of Feasts and Saints:**

**Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> June – St. Kevin (abbot) [498-618]** Known as the founder and first abbot of Glendalough in County Wicklow, Ireland.  
**St. Charles Lwanga and Companions (martyrs)** Ugandans convert to the Catholic Church, who were martyred for their faith and are revered as saints by both the Catholic Church and the Anglican Communion.

**Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> June – St. Boniface (bishop and martyr)** Anglo-Saxon missionary who propagated Christianity in the Frankish Empire during the 8<sup>th</sup> century. Patron Saint of Germany, the first archbishop of Mainz and the "Apostle of the Germans".

**Friday 6<sup>th</sup> June – St. Norbert (bishop) [1080-1134]** Archbishop of Magdeburg and founder of the Norbertine canons.  
**St. Jarlath (bishop)** Said to have been a disciple of St. Enda, and was taught also by St. Benignus. He became abbot-bishop of the monastery he founded at Tuam in the 6<sup>th</sup> century.

**Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> June – St. Colman (Macholmac) (bishop)** St. Colman of Dromore, Co. Down spent most of his life in that area. Possibly he studied under Caetan of Nendrom, Co. Down, and was persuaded by Saint Mac Nissi to settle at Dromore around 514.

- In parting with his disciples, Jesus gave them a mission for the future. Where, when and how did you get a sense of the meaning and purpose of your own life? How does that sustain you now? Is there any way in which that purpose ties in with the mission given to the eleven to spread the Good News?
- Have there been occasions when you have been able to give to others who were leaving you a message of hope, reassurance and direction?
- Jesus told his disciples that although he would not be with them as in the past he would be with them in a new way right through their lives. Have there been times when you were reassured by the love and support of another even though s/he was not physically present with you?
- Jesus promised to be with his disciples until the end of time. It is a promise he would fulfil through the gift of the Holy Spirit. That promise is also to us. What helps you to be aware of the presence of the Holy Spirit with you on life's journey?

At various points in the Gospels, we are treated to a brief glimpse of heaven – the baptism of Jesus by John, when the heavens open and God's voice is heard; the Transfiguration where Jesus is transformed in the presence of Peter, James and John; and the Ascension, when Jesus is lifted up into heaven before the disciples' very eyes. There are times when we get the sense that we have been treated to a glimpse of heaven – like when we are moved by a 'heavenly' experience, piece of music, sunset or breath-taking scenery. But today's feast of the Ascension reminds us that where Jesus has gone, we hope to follow. Elsewhere he tells us that he is going to prepare a place for us. We cannot imagine what lies in store in the life everlasting, the life beyond this life, which we hope to share with God. We can only see a reflection in this world of the splendour and beauty that awaits: 'The world is charged with the grandeur of God' (Gerard Manley Hopkins).
