 Guidelines on Use of Modern Technology when Working with Children – Use of Photography and Vide The use of photography and video is an issue of great concern among those working with children. The Dioce recognises that every parish has their own arrangements in relation to its use in schools, youth groups and for sacraments however the guidelines have been devised below to aid parishes and diocesan groups: It is always good practice to seek <i>written</i> permission from a parent or guardian before taking any photograp or video footage of children. This written permission must be sought from the parent/guardian or the person who owns the photograph before it can be displayed on promotional materials or websites.
