The 50th International Eucharistic Congress 2012: This will take place in Dublin from 10<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> June under the theme 'The Eucharist: Communion with Christ and with one another' and expects 25,000 pilgrims to participate each day, both from Ireland and from overseas.

It is an international gathering of people, which aims to promote an awareness of the central place of the Eucharist in the life and mission of the Catholic Church; help improve our understanding and celebration of the liturgy and draw attention to the social dimension of the Eucharist.



These aims are achieved through a programme of pastoral preparation in the years leading up to the Congress and the actual week of the Congress that consists of a programme of Prayer, Eucharist, workshops, discussion groups, catechesis and testimonies, cultural events, a youth space, tours, exhibitions, a Eucharistic Procession, a massive closing ceremony in Croke Park and more.

### Introduction of the new edition of the Roman Missal:

Posture during Mass: Bishop Hegarty commends the following common posture, as set down in the General *Instruction* (43) for observation throughout the diocese:

- 1. Standing from the beginning until the end of the Collect;
- 2. Standing from the *Orate Fratres* (pray brothers and sisters...) until the end of the *Sanctus*;
- 3. Standing from Concluding Prayer until the end of Mass.
- 4. The practice of kneeling during the Eucharistic Prayer and Communion is laudably retained.

Silence: Attention is drawn to articles 45 and 56 of the General Instruction which commend the observation of sacred silence at certain times before and during Mass.

### This Week's Calendar of Saints and Feasts:

Tuesday 6th December – St. Nicholas (bishop) 4th century bishop of Myra (in modern Turkey) whose legendary kindness inspired the Santa Claus tradition. He is Patron Saint of Russia, sailors, pawnbrokers and children.

Wednesday 7th December - St. Ambrose (bishop and doctor of the Church) [340-397] Converted to Christianity and was made bishop of Milan in 274 by popular acclaim. A brilliant teacher and preacher of the faith, he influenced Augustine who he received into the Church. Patron Saint of Milan, beekeepers and domestic animals.

Thursday 8th December - Feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary On this holy day of obligation we celebrate Mary, mother of Jesus. She was preserved free from sin from the first moment of her existence in the womb 'by a singular grace and privilege of Almighty God'.

Not celebrated this year

Friday 9th December - St. Juan Diego Cuauhtlatoatzin [1474-1548] Saw the vision of Our Lady of Guadalupe in December of 1531.

Sunday 11th December - St. Damascus I (pope) Born around 304 and died on this day in 384, was elected pope in 336. He insisted on the apostolic foundations of the Roman See and was active in opposing 4th century heresies. He commissioned St. Jerome to prepare the vulgate version of the bible.

### Seeing your life through the lens of the gospels - Mark 1:1-8:

- 1. John the Baptist is presented as a messenger to prepare the way for Jesus. Who have been messengers to you, preparing the way for the Lord by alerting you to ways in which you could improve your life? To whom have you been such a messenger?
- John calls the people to repentance (a change of heart), as a way to a new life. Can you recall times when you had a change of heart, and the change led to new life for you?
- John baptised people with water as a gesture to mark their change of heart. Sometimes we perform an action to symbolise our change of heart - write a letter, throw away our last cigarettes, etc. Can you remember a symbolic gesture with which you marked a change of heart? ### Questions people ask:

- Q. What is the connection between Santa Claus and St Nicholas?
- Santa comes from Sanctus meaning holy or saintly. Claus is a shortened form of Nicholas. So, Santa Claus literally means Saint Nicholas. Nicholas was a bishop in Turkey in the fourth century renowned for healing and generosity to the poor. One story is that he paid a dowry in gold to enable three girls to get husbands rather than be sold by their father to prostitution. The three golden balls outside a pawn shop recall that story. His feast was an occasion for giving toys and sweets to children. This custom was later linked with Christmas to celebrate the generosity of God in giving his Son as the dowry for our marriage with heaven. St Nicholas is Fr.
