The Deep End – Jesus Send Out the Seventy-Two:

If you asked Pope Francis what was the most important day in his life: his pontifical inauguration or his Baptism, what do you think he would say? Well, the correct answer would be his Baptism. As baptised Christians we are all anointed and sent out into the world. In today's Gospel Jesus sends out the seventy-two 'ahead of him' to all the surrounding towns and villages. In all our different roles in society we too are sent out 'ahead of him' as teachers, parents, ministers of various kinds, politicians, educators, social workers, students, nurses, whatever category we want to put ourselves into. The seventy-two in this passage are told to take nothing with them, no airs or graces, no judgements, no prejudices, just to go as they are and to meet the people where they are at.

We are all responsible for our Church, not just a select few. We all have different roles to play, we all have responsibilities. Instead of wondering what is going to happen in the future and why the 'labourers are so few', remember that Jesus sent out the seventy-two ahead of him and expects us all to play our role as leaders, as workers, as ministers, as people of God working together so that the 'Kingdom of God is very near'.

Do not be a "part-time" Christian, at certain moments, in certain circumstances, in certain choices. Be a Christian at all times! *Pope Francis*

Guidelines on Use of Modern Technology when Working with Children: - Use of photography and video The use of photography and video is an issue of great concern among those working with children. The Diocese recognises that every parish has their own arrangements in relation to its use in schools, youth groups and for the sacraments however the guidelines have been devised below to aid parishes and diocesan groups:

- It is always good practice to seek *written* permission from a parent or guardian before taking any photographs or video footage of children. This written permission must be sought from the parent/guardian or the person who owns the photograph before it can be displayed on promotional materials or websites. This can be incorporated in the registration form when a child joins a group (template permission Resource 10);
- Neither names nor any personal information should be displayed alongside any photographs;
- Special consideration should be given where taking photographs or video footage might be misinterpreted, or the images could be seen as provocative (e.g. beach trip or gymnastics display etc.). It is not to say, however, that with the right planning, these events cannot be recorded and enjoyed.
- Photography and video recording are important methods of recording social activity and providing an historic record illustrating and validating important moments in people's lives. This process is a powerful and personal one, and therefore we must respect the rights of everyone to make the choice whether or not to be photographed. The notice comes from the Safeguarding Policy and Procedures

This Week's Calendar of Feasts and Saints:
Monday 8th July – St. Killian (bishop and martyr) Was probably born in the parish of Mullagh in the
diocese of Kilmore. With 11 companions he left Ireland and became known as the
apostle of Thuringia and Eastern Franconia. With two others he was put to death c. 688.
There is a very strong devotion to him in Wurtzburg, where his remains lie, and also
throughout the Bavarian countryside.
Tuesday 9th July - St. Augustine Zhao Rong (priest) and companions (martyrs) St Augustine Tchao,
born in1746, converted to Christianity, was ordained priest and martyred in 1815. The
memorial also celebrates 119 companions, martyred in China over several centuries but
especially in the Boxer Rebellion.
Thursday 11th July – St. Benedict (abbot and Patron of Europe) Benedict was born into a distinguished family
in central Italy, studied at Rome and early in life was drawn to the monastic life. At first he
became a hermit, leaving a depressing world—pagan armies on the march, the Church torn
by schism, people suffering from war, morality at a low ebb.
He soon realised that he could not live a hidden life in a small town any better than in a
large city, so he withdrew to a cave high in the mountains for three years. Some monks
chose him as their leader for a while, but found his strictness not to their taste. Still, the shift
from hermit to community life had begun for him. He had an idea of gathering various
families of monks into one "Grand Monastery" to give them the benefit of unity, fraternity,
permanent worship in one house. Finally he began to build what was to become one of the
most famous monasteries in the world—Monte Cassino, commanding three narrow valleys
running toward the mountains north of Naples.
The Rule that gradually developed prescribed a life of liturgical prayer, study, manual labor
and living together in community under a common father (abbot). Benedictine asceticism is
known for its moderation, and Benedictine charity has always shown concern for the people
in the surrounding countryside. In the course of the Middle Ages, all monasticism in the
West was gradually brought under the Rule of St. Benedict.
Today the Benedictine family is represented by two branches: the Benedictine Federation
and the Cistercians.

Lough Derg Traditional Three Day Pilgrimage: The last date for entering the island is Friday 13th August. This pilgrimage attracts people of all ages and walks of life, from different cultures and social backgrounds. Stepping outside their ordinary lives and routine, they leave behind many of the trappings of the modern world. Pilgrims will have begun their commitment by fasting from the previous midnight: they follow a set routine of prayers and actions, hallowed by centuries of practice, all the while fasting and walking barefooted. Pilgrims make nine 'Stations' during their time on the island. The Station is a mantra-type prayer; allowing pilgrims to get in touch with their real inner selves in a most authentic way. The challenging nature of the fasting vigil and Stations is complemented by excellent communal celebrations in the Basilica.
