At the beginning of Lent 2010, Fr. Hasson invited you to participate in a very limited parish census which will help in the computerisation of the parish and will be of assistance to Bishop Hegarty in his pastoral planning. Here is a summary of the returns. 344 invitations were distributed throughout the geographical area of Greencastle parish. 188 were

This Week's Calendar of Feasts:

Sunday 9th January - Feast of the Baptism of the Lord

Thursday 13th January – *St. Hilary (bishop and Doctor of the Church) [c.315-c.367]* Elected bishop of Poitieres c.358 and distinguished himself by his stand against Arianism. In exile (356-359) by order of Emperor Constantine, he used the time to write. His major works include De Trinitate, a study of the Trinity.

Saturday 15th January – St. Ita (virgin) Was one of the early Irish women saints whose name is remembered in many place-names. A native of Co. Waterford, in the 6th century she founded a monastery in Killeedy, Co. Limerick. She was given the title 'foster-mother of the saints of Ireland.' Died in 570.

Sunday 16th January – St. Fursa (abbot and missionary) Was born in Ireland and became one of the great missionaries abroad. He went first with his brothers Foillan and Ultan to live the monastic life in East Anglia. But as great numbers continued to visit him there he left Fiollan as abbot and sought refuge in a hermitage given to him by a patron at Lagny on the Marne in France. He died about 650 while on a journey. His body was buried at Péronne, which became a great centre of devotion to him. Not celebrated this year.

Seeing your life through the lens of the gospels – *Matthew 3:13-17*:

- 1. The Baptism of Jesus marks a turning point in his life and the start of his public ministry. Recall moments when your life changed and you moved into a new phase.
- 2. The experience was one in which Jesus had a new sense of his own identity. What have been the experiences which have helped shape your sense of who you are?
- 3. How have you come to an awareness of being a child of God, beloved by God and one on whom rests the grace of God?
- It is surprising that Jesus, the Saviour of the world, asks to be baptised by John. The request symbolises his desire to identify with us. At the same time he is filled with the Holy Spirit. That step of identifying with us is an important element in his being able to help us. Have you ever found that when someone can identify and empathise with you, it is easier for him/her to help you? Has your ability to identify with others had any impact on your effectiveness in helping them?

Questions people ask:

- Q. Can you explain why Jesus who was sinless had to receive baptism from John?
- A. This of course wasn't the sacrament of baptism as we know it but a ritual washing which John used to indicate a change of life. Although Jesus did not need this ritual washing, he freely chose to enter into solidarity with all who needed salvation. Thus he anticipated his sacrificial death on Calvary when he died to save us from our sins. His involvement with sinful humanity was total. St Paul wrote that God made the sinless one to be sin so that we might be justified before God.

The Deep End - The Beloved Son:

I have always found it strange to celebrate the feast of the baptism of Jesus so soon after Christmas. No sooner have we had time to reflect on the vulnerable little baby figure in the crib, than we are catapulted into the first public appearance of the adult Jesus as he receives the mandate for his mission on earth.

Yet this dramatic leap forward reflects the movement of the Gospels.

We know very little of Jesus' life between the story of his birth and this story which marks the beginning of his public mission. Much as it would be intriguing to learn more about the young Jesus, the Gospels do not spend time on stories from Jesus' childhood and young adulthood. Rather, they move very swiftly from the beginning of his life on earth to the beginning of his public ministry.

We can sympathise with the hesitation of John the Baptist, who has been preaching about the one who is to come after him and recognises that this is a big moment. He is reluctant to baptise Jesus, saying 'It is I who need baptism from you, and yet you come to me!'

Yet Jesus knows things are as they should be. He is ready to begin the task he has been sent to do, with the highest possible approval for his mission: the voice from heaven saying 'This is my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on him.'
