As an organisation, we rely on our volunteers to help us provide services to families. When a premature baby is discharged from hospital, it can be very daunting for parents to care for a small, vulnerable baby whilst juggling with the demands of family life and perhaps, other young children. As well as premature and ill babies, TinyLife provides support to families who have experienced a multiple birth. Mums and dads at home with two or three babies really appreciate having a TinyLife volunteer to help with the never ending cycle of feeding, changing, bathing and rocking to sleep.

All TinyLife volunteers are people with a love for babies and young children who are keen to help families coping with young families. They may have children of their own or not. Some volunteers will have experience of premature or sick babies in their own family or extended family circle. Some volunteers may have worked in a paid or voluntary capacity with children. The Certificate in Lectio Divina Facilitation aims to equip participants to facilitate small Lectio Divina groups in a parish or community setting. Pope Francis in his apostolic exhortation Evangelii Gaudium recommended the ancient practice of lectio divina, a practice of prayerfully reading scripture and "allowing it to enlighten and renew us." This course is offered to men and women from all walks of life who have completed the Pathways course or its equivalent or who are involved in some form of prayer guidance or Scripture study. It is possible to do the course for validation by St. Mary's University College or for personal development alone.

This two-year programme runs from October to June each year and will be held on seven Saturdays from 10.00am to 4.30pm at Drumalis.

**Guidelines on Use of Modern Technology when Working with Children:** - **Use of photography and video** The use of photography and video is an issue of great concern among those working with children. The Diocese recognises that every parish has their own arrangements in relation to its use in schools, youth groups and for the sacraments however the guidelines have been devised below to aid parishes and diocesan groups:

- It is always good practice to seek written permission from a parent or guardian before taking any photographs or
  video footage of children. This written permission must be sought from the parent/guardian or the person who
  owns the photograph before it can be displayed on promotional materials or websites. This can be incorporated
  in the registration form when a child joins a group (template permission Resource 10);
- Neither names nor any personal information should be displayed alongside any photographs:
- Special consideration should be given where taking photographs or video footage might be misinterpreted, or the
  images could be seen as provocative (e.g. beach trip or gymnastics display etc.). It is not to say, however, that
  with the right planning, these events cannot be recorded and enjoyed.
- Photography and video recording are important methods of recording social activity and providing an historic
  record illustrating and validating important moments in people's lives. This process is a powerful and personal
  one, and therefore we must respect the rights of all to make the choice whether or not to be photographed.

This material may also be viewed in the Safeguarding section of the Diocesan website.

### The Deep End – Fear and Faith:

How often are we motivated by fear? Fear of looking silly, fear of being laughed at or rejected, fear of failure, fear of losing everything we have worked for – some of these fears will be familiar to us.

In the Gospels fear is often the opposite of faith. Peter has enough faith to get out of the boat and start walking on the water, but as soon as he feels the force of the wind he becomes afraid and begins to sink. Sometimes we start out fine but lose motivation or momentum along the way. Events seem to conspire against us, we get tired and fearful, and it is easier to just give up.

Some of the most powerful and consoling words of Jesus are contained in this Gospel passage: 'Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid.' When we are afraid, Jesus is there to lift us out of our fear. When we lose faith, doubt ourselves, and feel as though we are sinking, Jesus stretches out his hand to us. Next time you are panicking, stressed or fearful, spend some time in prayer. If you struggle to find the words, why not echo Peter's cry, 'Lord! Save me!' Let Jesus lift you back into the boat and help you get back on track.

#### Musings

Salvador Ryan (St. Patrick's College, Maynooth)

Today's First Reading has God's 'still small voice' tip-toe up to Elijah ears without fanfare.

The famous American Trappist monk and spiritual writer, Thomas Merton (1915-68) once wrote that 'the inspirations of the Holy Spirit are quiet, for God speaks in the silent depths of the spirit. It does not arouse excitement, but allays it, because excitement belongs to uncertainty.' In another place he cautioned 'If we strive to be happy by filling all the silences of life with sound, productive by turning all life's leisure into work, and real by turning all our being into doing, we will only succeed in producing a hell on earth.'

#### This Week's Calendar of Feasts and Saints:

- Monday 11th August St. Clare (virgin) [1193-1253] Followed St. Francis in his life of poverty and was founder of the Poor Claires. Patron saint of television. [Not celebrated this year]
- Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> August St. Jane Frances de Chantal (religious) [1572-1641] At the age of twenty she married Baron de Chantal but after nine years she was left a widow with four children. Her friendship with St Francis de Sales led to the foundation of the Congregation of the Visitation.
- Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> August *St. Pontian (pope and martyr) and St. Hippolytus (priest and martyr)* Pontius became bishop of Rome in 230 but was exiled in Sardinia where he abdicated during persecution in 235. Hippolytus was a Roman priest. Both died of ill treatment and are honoured as martyrs.
- Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> August St. Maximilian Kolbe (priest and martyr) [1894-1941] a Conventional Franciscan who worked in the apostolate of the press in Poland and Japan, and died in Auschwitz.
- Friday 15<sup>th</sup> August The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary This feast honours the fullness of blessedness that was Mary's destiny, the glorification of her immaculate soul and virginal body that completely conformed her to the risen Christ. Today is the patronal day of France. India, Malta and Paraguay.
- Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> August St. Stephen of Hungary [975-1038] The last Grand Prince of the Hungarians between 997 and 1000 or 1001, and the first King of Hungary from 1000 or 1001 until his death.

  A popular saint in Hungary and the neighbouring territories. In Hungary, his feast day is also a public holiday commemorating the foundation of the state.

- The story illustrates the power of faith. Have you noticed that when you believe in someone, or something, you
  can do things that would not be possible when you are full of doubts? Recall moments when your faith gave
  you strength and courage? Name for yourself the different kinds of faith that had this effect: belief in yourself,
  trust in another, faith in God.
- 2. When Jesus got into the boat the winds ceased. Who has been a Jesus person for you and helped to calm a storm that frightened you or made you anxious?
- 3. The experience of Peter gives encouragement to us when we waver in our trust and belief in God. In his doubt and fear Jesus reached out to him. Who has reached out a helping hand to you when you felt you were sinking?
- 4. The story ends with a profession of faith in Jesus as the Son of God. Have you had experiences of being rescued from some hazard or danger, experiences which deepened your faith in the presence and compassion of God for you?
