Year of Faith Parish Pilgrimage to the Mass Rock in the Townland of Crouck: On Sunday 4th August the Parish Faith community of Greencastle parish in Co. Tyrone, numerically the smallest and physically the highest in the Diocese of Derry gathered with visitors and friends at a local Mass Rock in the townland of Crouck to celebrate 'The Year of Faith' initiated by Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI on Thursday 11th October, 2012. The Mass rock at Crouck is one of three in this mountain parish the others being in the townlands of Formil and Dorville. The Eucharist was led by Fr. Eugene Hasson, parish priest in this community and con-celebrated by Fr. C. Kevin Gillespie SJ, President of Saint Joseph's University, Philadelphia who in his homily paid tribute to the inheritance of faith this generation has received from previous generations, celebrated the faith of those who had come together on this mountainside in the Sperrins and gave encouragement to all for the journey that lies ahead and Fr. Mark Monaghan SMA, a native of neighbouring Drumragh parish, ministering in Nigeria. A huge dark cloud greeted the pilgrims to this sacred site as they gathered but it moved on and was replaced by warm sunshine that added to the joy-filled spirit of all who had gathered. When the tunes of the final hymn 'Thanks Be To God' filtered down the valley towards Glenhull a sending-out liturgy took place in which a lighted candle, symbol of faith was passed from a parishioner in his ninth decade of life, through eight further generations to an eight year old parishioner who earlier this year had received the sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist for the first time. Each 'passing' was accompanied by a prayer of thanksgiving and of joyful hope. While this took place the whole gathering of around three hundred people gently descended the hillside until they reached the place where their pilorimage had begun - a metaphor for the journey of faith in this special year. I wish to pay tribute to everyone who helped prepare for the occasion and everyone who participated in even the slightest way. Going together on a physical pilgrimage of this kind calumniating in a celebration of the Eucharist is a call for deeper involvement and commitment to faith and parish life and it is my praver that we as a parish faith-community will continue to mature and grow from last Sunday's experience. Seeing your life through the lens of the gospels – Luke 12:32-48: John B

- 1. The opening verses of this Gospel passage invite us to ask ourselves: what do we see as our purpose in life? What are our priorities? Is our heart set on material progress and advance or do we have other priorities? What has helped you to appreciate that there is more to your life than earthly possessions and success?
- 2. At times one can sense in Jesus an urgency, as if he wanted to shake people and wake them up to take his words seriously. The parable has that tone: 'Be dressed for action and have your lamps lit.' When have you found that being alert enabled you to grasp a moment of opportunity that you might easily have missed, e.g., when a child or friend gives a hint that they would like to talk and a very meaningful conversation ensues.
- 3. Another consideration that adds to the sense of urgency in the words of Jesus is that we only have one life, and we do not know how long that will last. So Jesus calls us on us to live in the now and to treasure our time. Sometimes we can drift aimlessly through a day and on other occasions use a day purposefully. What difference does that make, if any, to how you experience the day?

- Q. Is it possible to fear God and love God at the same time?
- A. One must distinguish between unhealthy fear which causes terror and healthy fear which breeds humility and reverence. The terrifying sort of fear fails to recognise God's love and mercy. The Deep End – My Freezer is Too Full:

It sometimes takes a major disaster to put the spotlight on the ever-ready nature of the emergency services. The aftermath of the recent Boston Marathon bombings showed how quickly paramedics, doctors and emergency medical staff can spring into action to aid people in distress. When on call, fire-fighters and paramedics are 'dressed for action', ready to run when the call comes.

Jesus talked to his disciples about being 'dressed for action'. He told the disciples to 'have their lamps lit', and to be awake when the master comes – just like servants waiting for their master to return from a wedding feast.

How can we 'dress for action', so that we are ready when Jesus calls us from this life? We do not have the luxury of knowing when that day will come. It can be easy to fall into the trap of thinking 'My master is taking his time coming' and postponing our good behaviour for another time. If we knew when our time was going to be up, we could arrange our lives accordingly – culminating perhaps in a dramatic death-bed confession and conversion! But that is not the life Jesus calls us to.

Guidelines on Use of Modern Technology when Working with Children: - **Use of photography and video** The use of photography and video is an issue of great concern among those working with children. The Diocese recognises that every parish has their own arrangements in relation to its use in schools, youth groups and for the sacraments however the guidelines have been devised below to aid parishes and diocesan groups:

- It is always good practice to seek written permission from a parent or guardian before taking any photographs
 or video footage of children. This written permission must be sought from the parent/guardian or the person
 who owns the photograph before it can be displayed on promotional materials or websites. This can be
 incorporated in the registration form when a child joins a group (template permission Resource 10);
- Neither names nor any personal information should be displayed alongside any photographs;
- Special consideration should be given where taking photographs or video footage might be misinterpreted, or the images could be seen as provocative (e.g. beach trip or gymnastics display etc.). It is not to say, however, that with the right planning, these events cannot be recorded and enjoyed.
- Photography and video recording are important methods of recording social activity and providing an historic record illustrating and validating important moments in people's lives. This process is a powerful and personal one, and therefore we must respect the rights of everyone to make the choice whether or not to be photographed.
