<p style="text-align: center;"><b>This Week's Calendar of Feasts and Saints:</b></p> <p><b>Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> March – St. Patrick (bishop and Principal Patron of Ireland)</b> Born in Roman Britain in the early 5<sup>th</sup> century, Patrick was taken captive at 16 years of age and brought by pirates as a slave to the Braid Valley in the glens of Antrim. He worked as a shepherd around Sliabh Mis (Mt. Slemish) near the present-day town of Ballymena. After six years he escaped back to Britain, but he heard God's call to return to convert the Irish. After studies for the priesthood in France, he returned as Bishop c. 432 and commenced the remarkable conversion of the Irish. Died in 491.</p> <p><b>Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> March – St. Cyril of Jerusalem (bishop and Doctor of the Church)</b> St. Cyril became the Archbishop of Jerusalem at 35. He was present at the Council of Constantinople in 381, where Jerusalem was first recognised as a patriarchal See, along with Rome, Antioch, Alexandria and Constantinople. This council is responsible for the Nicene Creed which was promulgated in its final form. Died on the 18<sup>th</sup> March, 386 at the age of 70, after 35 years as a bishop, of which 16 were spent in exile.</p> <p><b>Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> March – St. Joseph (husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary)</b> The Bible pays Joseph the highest compliment: he was a 'just' man, which means he was a man who was completely open to all that God wanted to do for him. The main feast of St. Joseph is on this date - 19<sup>th</sup> March. It was believed his death occurred on this day. The feast was fixed in the 15<sup>th</sup> century and was extended to the whole Church by Pope Gregory XV in 1621. On December 8<sup>th</sup> 1870, Pope Pius IX ordered that this feast be celebrated throughout the Church. Holy Church also dedicates to St. Joseph the entire month of March. In addition, by custom, Wednesday of each week is dedicated to St. Joseph. The lineage of Mary's husband as the legal father of Jesus is traced in Matthew's gospel (1:18-25). Matthew sketches the confusion, humiliation and misery experienced by Joseph when he recognises that Mary is <i>with child</i>. This just man was simply, joyfully, and wholeheartedly obedient to God; in marrying Mary, in naming Jesus, in shepherding the precious pair to Egypt, in bringing them to Nazareth and in years of quiet faith and courage.</p> <p><b>Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> March – St. Enda (abbot)</b> Considered to be one of the three great late vocations (athlaech) of Ireland. His sister Faenche, a nun, set his thoughts on a religious vocation. He made a small foundation in Cell Aine, Co. Louth and after studies in Scotland under Ninian made several foundations in the Boyne valley. On Faenche's urging he went to Aran. Thought to have died in 520 and is considered as one of the early models of ascetic monasticism in Ireland.</p>

#### Seeing your life through the lens of the gospel – *John 3:14-21:*

1. Jesus speaks of himself being lifted up, a term that can mean a physical lifting, or also exaltation. By this play on words the evangelist explains to us that Jesus' gift of himself in the passion was a glorious revelation of love, despite all its injustice and brutality. Bring to mind occasions when the love shown by Jesus in his passion was a sacrament of God's love for you.
2. It would be very cushy for us if we could be a source of life to others without cost to ourselves. The true life-givers know that they need the generosity of being lifted up by giving their lives so that others may have life. Recall when you have had that generosity and give thanks for others who have been like that for you.
3. We receive life from God when our faith enables us to trust in God's love for us. We give life to one another when the love between us is trustworthy. Recall memories of that kind of trustworthy love. For whom have you been able to be a 'Jesus person' and give a love that another could trust? Who has shown that kind of love to you and been for you a sacrament of God's love?

Our Second Reading speaks of 'the immeasurable riches of God's grace'. There is a story told of Alexander the Great in which he told a favourite general to draw any amount from his treasury that he desired. The general complied and presented a bill for an enormous amount to the Treasurer, who refused to honour it. When Alexander asked the Treasurer about this, he complained about the large amount sought. But Alexander replied, 'Never mind, this general honours me and my kingdom by making such a great claim'. And so, likewise, we honour the riches of God's grace by asking in prayer for the 'big things'.

#### The Deep End – 'Those Who Do What is True Come to the Light':

Out of death comes new life. Have you ever seen someone come back to life? It may have been a friend who got over a really tough break up or someone who after many months of grief started to get their life back together again. Resurrection is all around us, all the time. It is easy for us to be cynical when we think of an issue like climate justice. As Christians we are called to be resurrection focused. There are always ways to turn a situation around, to make things right, to strive for life again and again. This is the vision that Jesus gives each of us, to love and hope rather than despair.

We have been journeying this Lent with Mahlet (which means 'Life') and her family from Sebeya. Mahlet and her family have contributed nothing to the problem of climate change, yet they are the ones who suffer the most when the rains fail. They will benefit from a new irrigation system being built with help from Trócaire this year, helping to ensure food security for Mahlet's family and other's in her village. We can make a real difference to people's lives through the small choices we make: the promise to live more simply and more sustainably. It is up to us and we can choose to be part of the solution rather than the problem. Take the option for radical love, for hope, for climate justice.
