**Guidelines on Use of Modern Technology when Working with Children – Use of Photography and Video:**

The use of photography and video is an issue of great concern among those working with children. The Diocese recognises that every parish has their own arrangements in relation to its use in schools, youth groups and for the sacraments however the guidelines have been devised below to aid parishes and diocesan groups:

- It is always good practice to seek *written* permission from a parent or guardian before taking any photographs or video footage of children. This written permission must be sought from the parent/guardian or the person who owns the photograph before it can be displayed on promotional materials or websites. This can be incorporated in the registration form when a child joins a group (template permission Resource 10);
- Neither names nor any personal information should be displayed alongside any photographs;
- Special consideration should be given where taking photographs or video footage might be misinterpreted, or the images could be seen as provocative (e.g. beach trip or gymnastics display etc.). It is not to say, however, that with the right planning, these events cannot be recorded and enjoyed.

Photography and video recording are important methods of recording social activity and providing an historic record – illustrating and validating important moments in people's lives. This process is a powerful and personal one, and therefore we must respect the rights of all to make the choice whether or not to be photographed.

**Seeing your life through the lens of the gospel:** *John Byrne OSA (jbyrneosa@gmail.com)*

1. This judgement scene contains surprises for us. One surprise is that nobody is condemned for doing wrong, but for their failure to do good. Being a disciple of Jesus is a positive choice about how we live and relate to others. Perhaps sin-avoidance has sometimes dominated your view of what was being asked of you. What difference has it made for you when you viewed your Christian life as a daily opportunity to make a positive difference to others?
2. Another way of saying this is that the aim of Christian living is not me-centred (about my personal sanctification) but other-centred (about responding to the needs of others). What happens to you when you get caught up in yourself? Is your life not better, and often more enjoyable, when you can look beyond yourself to others?
3. Another surprise is to hear Jesus tell us that when we do something for another, he considers it done to himself. When has seeing Christ in others helped you in your dealings with them?
4. The story is about the judgement of the whole of humanity. It presents an ideal of society in which human relationships at all levels are governed by the law of love. In your experience what difference has it made to a group to which you belonged when there was a definite sensitivity to the needs of all members?

It is hard not to feel sorry for the third servant in today's gospel. The first two servants are praised for making the most of the 'talents' (money) given to them by their master. In return, they are promised even greater things. The third man, paralysed by uncertainty, buries his small amount of money in the ground instead of doing something with it. His actions are based in fear – he has heard the master is tough and he does not want to take any risks. At least he is able to return what he has been given, he reasons.

But he is shocked to learn that instead of praise, or even a neutral reaction to match his own neutral actions, he is reprimanded as 'wicked and lazy' and cast out. This parable has been described as a story of 'tragic miscalculation'. The servant didn't do anything awful – which is why we tend to have some sympathy for him – but he didn't do his best either. The real tragedy is not that he didn't make any more money; it is that he failed to appreciate the opportunity he had been given and to make the most of it.

We are all dealt different cards in life, and undoubtedly some are much tougher than others. We are like the servants in the parable who are given different amounts of money to look after. The point is not the amount of 'talents' given to each. It is not the circumstances of our lives or our natural gifts that are important, but how we use them. Jesus was cautioning against playing it safe. Instead of turning inwards or living in fear, we are called to meet challenges head on and discover what wonderful things might happen.

**Church Restrictions:** Below we share with you those restrictions applying to churches and church activity sent to parishes by Bishop McKeown. It is important to note that it is based on Regulations from the government. Regulations are legally binding, which means that the restrictions are enforceable in law. It is for this reason that the Bishop uses the words "mandatory" and "illegal" below.

**Face Coverings:** It is mandatory in civil law that face coverings are worn when entering or leaving a place of worship, or being in a place of worship but not seated. The wearing of a face covering is mandatory unless a person has a reasonable excuse such as children under 13 years of age or a medical reason.

**Indoor Gatherings at Private Dwellings:** It is illegal to attend a funeral or wake in a private dwelling.

**Funerals and Burials:** It is illegal to organise, operate or participate in a gathering of more than 25 persons for the purpose of a funeral or the burial of a body. Apart from immediate family it is only possible to view a body in a funeral home.

**Marriages:** It is illegal to organise, operate or participate in a gathering of more than 25 persons for the purpose of solemnising a marriage.

All of these regulations go against our natural human instincts to either comfort and console friends and neighbours or celebrate important occasions. However we need to do all we can for the common good and to protect lives and find other ways to do the above within the law. Please help us as we implement these difficult regulations over the next few weeks.

### Arrangements for other Sacraments and Ceremonies:

**Baptism:** If you have a child for baptism contact Fr. Gallagher and a date and time for baptism will be organised.

**Marriage:** Most weddings for 2020 have been rearranged for 2021. Any weddings in church in 2021 will follow government capacity regulations.

**Confession:** In the short-term during summer months (weather permitting) Fr. Gallagher will be available for Confession in the graveyards on Saturdays from 5.30pm to 5.50pm in St. Patrick's Church and Sundays from 8.30am to 8.50am in Our Lady of the Wayside. Confession with social distancing and privacy in the church building is quite difficult to achieve, hopefully this will resume in the near future.

**Funerals:** According to present regulations only 30 people are permitted in the church or cemetery at a time.

*Please note that as regulations change we will either extend or roll back on these arrangements*

### Deanery of Tyrone Statistics

17 Parishes in West Tyrone and East Donegal. An estimated Catholic population of 65,670 people are currently served by 20 Derry Diocesan priests under retirement age with assistance of 3 priests in residence and a chaplain to the Polish community.

8 parishes (47%) have a Catholic population of less than 3,000

6 parishes (35%) have a Catholic population of 3,000-7,000 people

3 parishes (18%) have a Catholic population of greater than 7,000 people

The largest parish serves an estimated 11,500 Catholics

7 parishes have 1,500 parishioners or less (7,900 combined) each with a resident priest. Is this sustainable?

In 2008 there were 27 diocesan clergy under retirement age ministering in the Tyrone Deanery, as of 2018 that number is 20. 7 Parish Priests currently serving in the deanery will reach 75 before 2025.

The maximum number of ordinations across the Derry Diocese by 2025 is 3.

Age profile: 1 priest is in his 30s, 1 in 40s, 7 in 50s, 6 in 60s and 5 in 70s

The clergy population has dropped 26% between 2008 and 2018 and by 2025 will have dropped by 52%

### This Week's Calendar of Feasts and Saints:

**Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> November – St. Albert the Great (bishop and Doctor of the Church) [1206-1280]**

Dominican theologian who taught in Cologne, was called the 'Universal Teacher' for the vast range of his interests. Patron Saint of scientists.

**Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> November – St. Elizabeth of Hungary (religious) [1207-1231]**

Queen at 14, widowed and exiled at 20, Franciscan tertiary until her death at 24. A woman of prayer and service of the poor.

**Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> November – Dedication of the Basilicas of St. Peter and St. Paul, Rome** This feast celebrates the dedications of two of the four major basilicas of Rome. These two churches continue to draw millions of faithful pilgrims each year as well as many visitors from other faiths.

**Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> November – Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary** Originated in the East and was included on the General Calendar in the 16<sup>th</sup> century. With the feasts of Immaculate Conception and the Nativity of Mary, this feast reminds us that Mary was the chosen vessel of God from the very first moment of her life.

**Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> November – St. Cecilia (virgin and martyr)** The patroness of music and musicians, was a 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> century Roman Christian martyr. According to tradition, she refused to worship the Roman gods and was beheaded. Her association with music and the representations of her playing the organ probably grew from a misunderstanding of a 5<sup>th</sup> century account of her life.

**Month's Mind / First Anniversary Masses:** As mentioned above we need your cooperation in the celebration of these significant occasions. We therefore request that only immediate family and closest friends attend Month's Mind or First Anniversary Masses. Unfortunately, under no circumstances can people congregate in the church porch, grounds or graveyard to follow the mass. Mass can be followed from St. Patrick's Church on YouTube. As the organiser of funerals, burials etc. is deemed to be the Parish Priest any consequence of the breaching of the mandatory regulations becomes the responsibility of the Parish Priest.

### Spiritual Communion Prayer: A prayer for those unable to attend mass and receive Holy Communion and are participating in mass from home

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love you above all things and I desire to receive you in my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to you.
