Seeing your life through the lens of the gospels – Matthew 25: 14-30: John Bvrne OSA (iohn@orlagh.ie)

- Jesus was angry at the way some Jewish leaders treated God's revelation of his love for his people. They 1. had buried it by obscuring it under a multiplicity of rules. These became the centre of religious practice rather than a deep faith and trust in the forgiving love of God. What part have rules played for you in your life? Have they been life-giving?
- On the level of our own personal life, faith is not given to us to be locked away, but to be 'traded' with. We 2 trade with it when we believe in its value, trust it, and use it, bringing it into the experiences we have in daily life. Can you recall times when relying on your faith has brought you rewards?
- 3. Likewise with our own personal gifts and talents. We can fall into the trap of seeing these as our personal possession so that we can do with them as we like, rather than share them as gifts so that they can be multiplied. What is your experience of hoarding or sharing your own gifts? When did you feel most alive?
- 4. The master in the story is also someone we can celebrate. He is the kind of person who does not cling to power. He entrusts his property (his cause) to others. Perhaps you have known leaders who have done this? Have you done it yourself? As parents have you entrusted the lives of your children to them so that they can find life to the full by taking responsibility for their own lives?

The nineteenth-century English convert, Fr Frederick W. Faber, is perhaps best known for his composition of Faith of Our Fathers. However, another of his hymns, which speaks of God's limitless mercy, communicates an even more powerful message: 'There's a wideness in God's mercy like the wideness of the sea'. Faber notes. however, that 'we make his love too narrow by false limits of our own; and we magnify his strictness with a zeal he will not own.' And so we create a God who reflects our sense of justice rather than his. To paraphrase Voltaire: God made us in his image and likeness - and we have repaid the compliment.

The Deep End – The Parable of the Talent:

The parable we read today is not a lesson in capitalism. We must bear in mind that Jesus is frustrated with those who had been entrusted with ministering to his people. They had excluded the people and laid heavy burdens upon them. When we read the parable in this sense we can understand the exasperation of the Master. The talents should have been used to transform people's lives; used for embracing those on the margins; for standing up against injustice and inequality in the world. Yet many were afraid or blind to this, so they hid the talents and did not multiply them. It is a safer place to be.

Compare this outcome to the other servants. There is a beautiful verse in both cases which reads 'enter into the joy of your master'. Is this not what happens when we find that path that is right for us? Joy! When we use our talents and gifts in work or projects that are life-giving and meeting the needs of our communities? Joy is a fantastic emotion; a sign of God's grace. Despite the frustrations of whatever work we are involved in, the presence of joy is one sign that we are on the Kingdom track. The challenge is not to be afraid to go out there. Pope Francis asks that we have the 'smell of the sheep' and calls us to 'be courageous. A Church that does not go out of itself, sooner or later, sickens from the stale air of closed rooms'.
