'Do This In Memory of Me' Our First Holy Communion parish programme will continue at the Vigil Mass in Saint Patrick's this weekend (Saturday 15th December). Our next Sunday gathering will be at the Vigil Mass for the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (26th January, 2008).

Pope's New Encyclical, 'Spe Salvi' Addresses Modern Crisis of Hope: In an encyclical on Christian hope, Pope Benedict XVI said that without faith in God, humanity lies at the mercy of ideologies that can lead to "the greatest forms of cruelty and violations of justice." The pope warned that the modern age has replaced belief in eternal salvation with faith in progress and technology, which offer opportunities for good but also open up "appalling possibilities for evil." "Let us put it very simply: Man needs God, otherwise he remains without hope," he said in the encyclical, Spe Salvi ("On Christian Hope"), released Nov. 30. The 76-page text explores the essential connection between faith and hope in early Christianity and addresses what it calls a "crisis of Christian hope" in modern times. It critiques philosophical rationalism and Marxism and offers brief but powerful profiles of Christian saints—ancient and modern—who embodied hope, even in the face of suffering.

Today is **Gaudate** Sunday, which, taken from the first word of the Entrance Antiphon, means "rejoice." Penitential violet is replaced with rose, a colour of joy. The priest may wear rose vestments; rose may be woven into the liturgical decorations; and the third candle on the Advent wreath (traditionally rose) is lit even in the liturgical colours we sense a shift in the liturgies of the season. This shift will be especially noticeable beginning tomorrow, 17th December but even today's liturgy gives a hint that something is on the horizon. Possibly dating back to the Middle Ages, when the season of Advent bore an overly penitential character, the rose colours signalled joyfully that the church was closer to Christmas. Although today the rose colour is still a sign of the anticipatory Christmas joy, we understand the continuity of Advent as a season of 'devout joyful expectation'. Today's liturgy helps to heighten the expectation, which will carry through to the celebration of Christmas.
