#### This Week's Calendar of Saints:

**Monday 19<sup>th</sup> October** – **Saints John de Brebeuf and Isaac Jogues** with their six Jesuit companions were slain by Huron and Iroquois Indians in 1647-1648.

St. Paul of the Cross (1694-1775) founded the Passionists in Rome, preaching of the passion of Christ and tending the sick, the dying and the lapsed.

Friday 23rd October – St. John of Capistrano (1386-1456) studied civil and canon law and joined the
Franciscan order. A faithful servant of four popes, he attended the Council of Florence
went to Jerusalem as apostolic emissary and in 1451 set out on a preaching tour through

the German provinces and Poland. In a battle at Belgrade he contracted fever and died. Patron saint of jurists and military chaplains.

Satuday 24th October – St. Anthony Mary Claret (1807-1870) founded the Claretians in Spain for missionary work. Archbishop of Santiago, Cuba then returned as chaplain to the of Spain and built schools and museums before being exiled with the monarchy.

#### Seeing your life through the lens of the gospels - Mark 10:35-45:

- 1. Jesus had spent much time teaching his followers that discipleship was a life of service, a life giving oneself for others. In spite of that, James and John were thinking of what they could get out of it. For Jesus, for the apostles, and for each one of us, the glory of God is revealed when we allow God to work through us as we give ourselves for others. When have you found that you reach a fuller life and others benefit when you act in this spirit of service?
- 2. One of the great problems in a community, a parish, or an organisation, is when you have some people jockeying for status and positions of power. The good of the group and the people it serves take second place to personal prestige. You have probably seen this happen. Perhaps you have also witnessed people with a spirit of service that allowed them to value the good of the group over personal rewards. Recall them and give thanks for their witness.
- Jesus himself is the great model of this spirit of service. Think of the aspects of Jesus' life and ministry that have inspired you to imitate his giving of his life for others.

#### Questions people ask:

- Q. Is there any particular reason why St. Paul placed the name Christ before Jesus whereas we always say Jesus Christ?
- A. Jesus was the personal name of the Saviour while Christ, meaning the Anointed One or Messiah, was the title later bestowed on him when people accepted him as the promised Messiah. When Paul began writing, some 25 years after the life of Jesus, the messianic title, Christ, was popularly used as his name. Coming to accept Jesus as the Christ was a major factor in the conversion of Paul. This may explain why he frequently placed Christ before Jesus. For the record, his letters refer to Christ Jesus about 89 times, and to Jesus Christ about 80 times.

### The Deep End - Out of Reach:

Three priests sat discussing the best positions for prayer while a telephone repairman worked nearby. 'Kneeling is definitely best,' claimed one. 'No,' said another. 'I get the best results standing with my hands outstretched to heaven.' 'You're both wrong,' the third insisted. 'The most effective prayer position is lying prostrate, face down on the floor.' The repairman could contain himself no longer. 'Hey, fellas,' he shouted, 'the best prayin' I ever did was hangin' upside down from a telephone pole.' Not the first position you'd think of for prayer, but definitely one that works. Today's Gospel reading (Mark 10:42-45) describes another that works: that of servant. Not for prayer this time, but for mission. It makes the startling claim that the more we serve – even to becoming a slave of all – the more we advance as followers of Jesus, the closer we get to him in other words. We don't follow him just for our own sakes. Being with him means taking on his mission: bringing people back to God. Jesus did this by his witness and proclamation, by what he did and said. So, too, must we because baptism makes us missionaries, confirmation primes us to begin, God's word fires us to set out and reach out to others. Today we celebrate Mission Sunday, whose theme this year is Reach Out. So let's do just that. We can reach out wherever we are to whomever we wish.
