The Deep End:

St. Augustine longed to understand the doctrine of the Trinity and to be able to explain it logically. One day as he was walking along a beach he saw a little child on the shore. The child made a whole in the sand, ran to the sea with a little cup, filled her cup, came and poured it into the hole she had made in the sand. Back and forth she went. Augustine went up to her and said, 'Little child, what are doing?' and she replied, 'I am trying to empty the sea into this hole.' 'How do you think,' Augustine asked, 'that you can empty this immense sea into this tiny hole with this tiny cup?' To which she replied, 'And you, how do you suppose that with this, your small head, you can comprehend the immensity of God?'

One problem is that we have to use human language to describe the indescribable. But we can say that the relationships of the Trinity are relationships of love, relationships of giving and receiving, relationships of community and life.

'The Triune God can be compared to a flowering plant with its deep, invisible root (God), its green stem reaching into the world from that root (Son), and its flower (Spirit) which opens to spread beauty and fragrance and to fructify the earth with fruit and seed.
