World Meeting Of Families 2018 Collection: In 1994 Pope St. John Paul II asked the Pontifical Council for the Family to establish the World Meeting of Families as an international event of prayer, catechesis and celebration drawing participants from around the world. The World Meeting of Families was first celebrated in Rome in 1994. It was most recently held in Philadelphia (2015), attended by Pope Francis himself at which he announced the next World Meeting of Families would be held in Dublin in 2018. The event will be jointly organised by The Pontifical Council for the Family and the Archdiocese of Dublin. In preparation for the meeting a programme of pastoral preparation centred on the family will take place across Ireland particularly in 2017. Fundraising for the event is also necessary. The Irish Catholic Bishops Conference will be holding three National Sunday Church Collections over the coming years. The first of which will be next weekend (28th and 29th May) and in this parish will be taken up as a second collection after communion. Please be as generous as you can as we prepare for this important event in the life of the church in Ireland.

Guidelines on Use of Modern Technology when Working with Children – *Use of Photography and Video.*

The use of photography and video is an issue of great concern among those working with children. The Diocese recognises that every parish has their own arrangements in relation to its use in schools, youth groups and for the sacraments however the guidelines have been devised below to aid parishes and diocesan groups:

- It is always good practice to seek *written* permission from a parent or guardian before taking any photographs or video footage of children. This written permission must be sought from the parent/guardian or the person who owns the photograph before it can be displayed on promotional materials or websites. This can be incorporated in the registration form when a child joins a group (template permission Resource 10);
- Neither names nor any personal information should be displayed alongside any photographs;
- Special consideration should be given where taking photographs or video footage might be misinterpreted, or the images could be seen as provocative (e.g. beach trip or gymnastics display etc.). It is not to say, however, that with the right planning, these events cannot be recorded and enjoyed.

Photography and video recording are important methods of recording social activity and providing an historic record – illustrating and validating important moments in people's lives. This process is a powerful and personal one, and therefore we must respect the rights of all to make the choice whether or not to be photographed.

Child Safeguarding: If you or anyone you know has a concern or wishes to report an allegation directly to the statutory authorities, please contact the PSNI/or local Health and Social Care Trust. If you are contacting the latter, ask to speak to the Duty Social Worker. Alternatively if you have a child safeguarding concern in relation to any member of Church personnel and wish to report it to Church authorities, please contact one of the diocesan designated persons, who will in turn report your concern to the relevant statutory authorities. *See poster at entrances*

As a child in Dublin, the story of St. Patrick and his use of the shamrock to explain the mystery of three persons in one God was frequently repeated in homilies. The shamrock and symbols of The Trinity are frequently used in Celtic art and something that we especially associate with our Irish Church. The Book of Kells and other early Irish Gospel manuscripts are beautifully adorned with these sacred symbols. The response is completed by the words 'the God who is, who was, and who is to come' which remind me of the difficult concept of infinity. My prayer today is that the God who created me, lived on earth like me, will continue to inspire me to higher things.
