 It is always good practice to seek <i>written</i> permission from a parent or guardian before taking any photographs or video footage of children. - 2. It was his master's call to account that galvanised the servant into action. What have been the experiences, or people, that have galvanised you into action when you had been somewhat half-hearted in your efforts?
- 3. Who have been the people whose energy, drive and astuteness have been an inspiration to you in how to handle difficult situations?
- 4. 'No servant can be the slave of two masters'. When have you experienced the truth of this statement?
