Α.	Not exactly transferred but reunited with the feast of the Body of Christ. The feast formerly known as
	Corpus Christi (Body of Christ) is now the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. In the course of time the
	Eucharist became almost exclusively the sacrament of the Body of Christ with scarcely any mention of his
	Blood. People rarely receive from the chalice and very few Eucharistic hymns mention the Blood.
	Celebrating one feast in honour of the Body and Blood of Christ is more faithful to the Last Supper.
