Broughderg First Responders Scheme: The role of a First Responder is to attend, when possible a patient who has collapsed and administer CPR and / or defibrillation whilst waiting for an ambulance crew to attend. The Broughderg First Responders are volunteers who live and work in the local area they are fully trained and are fully insured. When an appropriate 999 call is received from the area covered by the First Responder Scheme; the volunteers are notified and try to attend to provide whatever care is reasonable. First Responders will only attend when dispatched by Ambulance Control. They have no role in the diagnosis or management of illness apart from the collapsed patient. There will always be a 999 ambulance in attendance. Volunteers are clearly identifiable as they will have ID with them. They will provide whatever care is reasonable and will endeavour to assist either doctors or members of the Ambulance Service as appropriate. The Family as Domestic Church: "Matrimony: Sacrament of Enduring Love" is the theme for Catechetical Sunday 2010. Each year the U.S. bishops choose a theme for catechists to focus on not only on the day but throughout the year. This marriage theme has particular importance for catechetics. When a woman and man pledge their faith and fidelity to each other before the community of the church, they bring into being a unique expression of life and love. Pope John Paul II, echoing Vatican II, spoke of this family as the domestic church, a smaller version of the greater church.

Just like the larger church, the family/domestic church has a mission, to share the love of Christ with the members of the family and with the world beyond. As a couple you become responsible for each other and for your growth in faith. As parents you become the first catechists for your children. Notice that I said first catechists, not the only catechists. Your role is to bear witness to your own faith in Jesus Christ. Children need to "see" their parents living lives of faith. Parish and school catechists can teach more systematically but unless the children experience a living faith in the family there is little chance that faith will grow deep roots.

Today life is complicated and busy. The work week isn't always Monday to Friday. Parents and couples juggle multiple priorities. Our relationship with God can become one of the casualties of the business of our lives, and when our relationship with God is wanting, what do we have to share with our children or with each other?

I invite each family, those with small children, school-aged children, no children or adult children, to examine the prayer life of your domestic church. Do you pray with each other and for each other? Do you witness your faith to each other and to others? On this Catechetical Sunday may I ask each couple and each family to rededicate yourself to strengthening your own faith and sharing that faith with the other members of your domestic church.

### This Week's Calendar of Feasts:

Sunday 26th September – St. Cosmas and St. Damian Not celebrated this year.

Monday 27th September – St. Vincent de Paul (priest) [1580-1660] Founded the Congregation of the Mission (The Vincentians) and the Daughters of Charity (1633), the first sisters to work outside their convents in active service. He is the Patron Saint of all charitable works.

Tuesday 28th September – St. Wenceslaus (martyr) [905-925] Prince of Bohemia, killed by his brother.

Patron Saint of brewers.

St. Lawrence Ruiz and Companions (martyrs) During the period between 1633 and 1637 these 16 martyrs shed their blood out of love for Christ in the city of Nagasaki in Japan.

Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> September – Feast of the Archangels Gabriel, Raphael and Michael Gabriel brought the message to Mary of the Annunciation (Patron Saint of telecommunications, radio and TV workers). Raphael was a guide to Tobias (Patron Saint of nurses, physicians and the blind). Michael has been venerated as protector of Christians in general and soldiers in particular (Patron Saint of radiologists and the sick paratroopers)

Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> September – *St. Jerome (priest and Doctor of the Church) [340-420]* Translated the bible into Latin and wrote commentaries on scripture. Patron Saint of librarians.

Friday 1st October – St. Therese of the Child Jesus (virgin and Doctor of the Church) Marie Francois

Therese Martin died at the Carmel in Lisieux on 30th September, 1897. She was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope John Paul II in 1997. Patron Saint of Missions, florists, aviators and France.

Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> October – *The Guardian Angels* This feast expresses God's personal care for each individual and our belief that God assigns everyone an angel to guard us.

Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> October – Blessed Columba Marmion Not celebrated this year.

### Seeing your life through the lens of the gospels – Luke 16:19-31:

- The first of the faults attributed to the rich man is his insensitivity to the abject poverty of those around him.
   When have you discovered that it is when you are aware of the needs of those around you and seek to make some response that you bring out the best in yourself?
- 2. The second fault attributed to the rich man is the way he ignored the word of God coming through Moses and the prophets. How have the Gospels, the scriptures or your faith opened you up to a deeper and more satisfying perspective on life?
- 3. Some people look to the spectacular for a sign of God's presence and action. For Jesus the lessons we need are not to be sought in the spectacular, but in the ordinary things of everyday life. Where have you found sacraments of God's presence in the world around you?

### The Deep End – Leaving It Too Late:

The Beano comic book for children used to sell in its early days for 2D. That's two pennies in old currency. Recently an edition of the first annual, from 1939, sold for £4,264. It was one of only 11 copies believed to be in existence. Just goes to show that what seems of little value today may be quite valuable tomorrow. It's good to prize things now, rather than regret later, perhaps.

That's certainly true of the rich man in today's Gospel (Luke 16:19-31). He didn't put much value on Lazarus at his doorstep begging each day. Later, when he sees how important Lazarus is, he comes to realise the error of his ways. But it's too late. This is not an easy parable to accept. It touches on things dark and deep: the condition of serious sinners after death. While he may not have harmed Lazarus during his lifetime, the rich man's heartless indifference to his plight was evil enough to land him in what we would call hell.

This is an unsettling parable. It's uncompromising in what it says. It poses too many problems to go into here, but it should stop me in my tracks. It's intended to. It forces me to ask questions I may not want to ask, questions that have little interest, immediacy, or value for me today, perhaps. But what about tomorrow? Certainly, one of those questions must be: do I take seriously the consequences of what I do, and don't do?

Is the thought of eternal damnation in any way for me like The Beano? Comical.
