Flu vaccines are for all patients registered with the Practice aged 65+ (born before 31-03-1956), those under 65 who suffer from a long standing condition such as Asthma, COPD, Diabetes, any Heart condition, Immuno compromised, Liver disease, Neurological problems, Kidney problems, patients with a BMI over 40, pregnant women, registered carers and all 2 to 3 year olds (born between 02-07-16 and 01-09-18). Also included this year are the household contacts of shielding patients. If you are unsure if you fall into one of the above categories, please contact the Medical Centre for advice. Please note that Primary School children and Year 8 children in secondary school will receive their flu vaccines in school. The Practice will contact the 2 to 3 year olds with regard to appointments

Initial drive through flu vaccine clinics will be held on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> October at Sperrin Family Practice, Plumbridge, between 10.00am and 1.00pm (no appointment necessary). ## Guidelines on Use of Modern Technology when Working with Children - Use of Photography and Video:

The use of photography and video is an issue of great concern among those working with children. The Diocese recognises that every parish has their own arrangements in relation to its use in schools, youth groups and for the sacraments however the guidelines have been devised below to aid parishes and diocesan groups:

- It is always good practice to seek written permission from a parent or guardian before taking any photographs or
  video footage of children. This written permission must be sought from the parent/guardian or the person who
  owns the photograph before it can be displayed on promotional materials or websites. This can be incorporated in
  the registration form when a child joins a group (template permission Resource 10);
- Neither names nor any personal information should be displayed alongside any photographs;
- Special consideration should be given where taking photographs or video footage might be misinterpreted, or the
  images could be seen as provocative (e.g. beach trip or gymnastics display etc.). It is not to say, however, that
  with the right planning, these events cannot be recorded and enjoyed.

Photography and video recording are important methods of recording social activity and providing an historic record – illustrating and validating important moments in people's lives. This process is a powerful and personal one, and therefore we must respect the rights of all to make the choice whether or not to be photographed.

#### This Week's Calendar of Feasts and Saints:

Sunday 27th September – St. Vincent de Paul (priest) [1580-1660] Founded the Congregation of the Mission (the Vincentians) and the Daughters of Charity (1633), the first sisters to work outside their convents in active service. He is the patron of charitable works.

Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> September – *St. Jerome (priest and Doctor of the Church) [340-420]* Translated the bible into Latin and wrote commentaries on scripture. Patron Saint of librarians.

Thursday 1st October – St. Thérèse of Lisieux (virgin and doctor of the Church) Marie Françoise-Thérèse
Martin died at the Carmel in Lisieux on 30th September, 1897. She was declared a
doctor of the Church by Pope John Paul II in 1997. Patron Saint of Missions, florists,
aviators and France.

Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> October – *The Guardian Angels* This feast expresses God's personal care for each individual and our belief that God assigns everyone an angel to guard us.

Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> October – *Blessed Columba Marmion [1858-1953]* An Irish monk, and the third abbot of Maredsous Abbey. Beatified by Pope John Paul II on 3<sup>rd</sup> September, 2000, Marmion was one of the most popular and influential Catholic writers of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. His books are considered spiritual classics.

Sunday 4<sup>th</sup> October – St. Francis of Assisi (priest) [1181/1182-1282] Abandoned all things for the love of Christ. Founded the Friars Minor and with St. Clare, the Poor Clares. For the last two years of his life he suffered the stigmata. Patron Saint of ecologists.

In 2008 there were 27 diocesan clergy under retirement age ministering in the Tyrone Deanery, as of 2018 that number is 20. 7 Parish Priests currently serving in the deanery will reach 75 before 2025.

The maximum number of ordinations across the Derry Diocese by 2025 is 3.

Age profile: 1 priest is in his 30s. 1 in 40s. 7 in 50s. 6 in 60s and 5 in 70s

The clergy population has dropped 26% between 2008 and 2018 and by 2025 will have dropped by 52%
