The previous Missal, of Pope Paul VI used since 1969 will no longer be used. It has been used for the celebration of Mass by six parish priests and many visiting clergy over the years since it was introduced. If you would like to purchase either of these two missals for your own keepsake, you may bid to do so by *silent auction*. Introduction of the new edition of the Roman Missal:

Posture during Mass: Bishop Hegarty commends the following common posture, as set down in the *General Instruction* (43) for observation throughout the diocese:

- 1. Standing from the beginning until the end of the Collect;
- 2. Standing from the *Orate Fratres* (pray brothers and sisters...) until the end of the *Sanctus*:
- 3. Standing from Concluding Prayer until the end of Mass.
- 4. The practice of kneeling during the Eucharistic Prayer and Communion is laudably retained.

Silence: Attention is drawn to articles 45 and 56 of the *General Instruction* which commend the observation of sacred silence at certain times before and during Mass.

This Week's Calendar of Saints and Feasts:

Wednesday 30th November – St. Andrew (Apostle) Andrew from Bethsaida was a disciple of St. John the Baptist when he was called by Jesus. He in turn brought his brother Peter to Jesus. He is said to have suffered martyrdom on this date by crucifixion, but the tradition of an X-shaped cross is much later. Patron Saint of Scotland, Russia and fishermen.

Saturday 3rd December – St. Francis Xavier (priest) [1506-1552] One of the first 7 Jesuits, he was sent to India by St. Ignatius. He converted many in Goa and Japan. Was killed as he tried to enter China. A Patron Saint of the Missions.

Sunday 4th December – St. John Damascene (priest) [675-749] A Syrian Christian theologian. He became a priest in the monastery of St. Sabas near Jerusalem and was a leading figure in the defence of icons in the iconoclastic controversy. Not celebrated this year

Questions people ask:

- Q. These changes to the Mass will be the last straw for people who are barely hanging on. Don't you think that they will be leaving the Church in droves?
- A. Obviously there are people who are easily frustrated and have no patience with any change. But looking at the changes in a positive way, the new translation might make us slow down and look with fresh eyes at the beauty of the prayers and responses at Mass. There is a greater reverence in the new translation and that is a good thing. Instead of rattling off the Gloria or Creed at top speed, the fresh wording is an opportunity to ponder on the majesty and beauty of these prayers. Seeing your life through the lens of the gospels - Matthew 13:33-37:

- 1. The coming of the master is not just the moment of death, but any moment of grace. Recall unexpected graces good things that happened when they were not anticipated.
- Perhaps some of these were moments when you were particularly alert and aware of what was going on in you and around you and this enabled you to be open to a moment of grace. Recall the contrast with moments when that alertness and awareness were not present.
- 3. The servants were given charge of the household 'each with their own job'. Identify with the servants as people given a responsibility within the household of God's people. What has it been like for you when you have been shown trust in this way by another person? What is it like for you to see yourself trusted in this way by God?
- 4. What is your experience of good 'doorkeepers', people who were there and ready to receive you even when you came at an awkward or unexpected time. Also your experience of being a good 'doorkeeper' for another.

The Deep End - Wake-Up Call:

Many of us will have noticed a change in the language used at Mass in recent weeks. Since September we have been getting used to a series of changes to the Mass, and today, the first Sunday of Advent, the new translation of the Missal comes fully into effect.

You will be aware that some of the congregation's responses are changing, such as the use of 'And with your spirit' instead of 'And also with you'. There are also changes to some of the people's prayers such as the Confiteor, the Gloria, the Creed, and the Sanctus, and to the parts of the Mass spoken by the priest.

Specially produced congregational cards and missalettes are available in our parishes to assist us as we familiarise ourselves with the new wording. We will all need to be on our toes to make sure we are getting the responses and prayers right. Until we get used to the new wording, we will be more alert than usual. We will not be able to rattle off prayers without thinking, as can be so easy to do when the words are so familiar.

What a fitting time, then, to introduce the new translation. In today's Gospel, Jesus urges his disciples to 'be on your guard', to 'stay awake'. It is very much in the spirit of Advent that we stay alert. When we pray we do more than recite words. Let us use this time to discover anew the meaning of the Mass.
