St. Comgall was born around 526 in Co. Antrim. His father was a soldier and wished his son to follow in his steps but Comgall wished to become a soldier of Christ. He studied under Finian of Molville and deepened his life of prayer to counteract his temptations to boredom and homesickness. He was persuaded to become a priest and then established a monastery at Bangor around 555-558, which attracted people like Columbanus. He also founded a monastery at Tiree in Scotland. He died after a long illness at Pentecost 602 or 605.

- "If you love me you will keep my commandments', and specifically the commandment to love one another (cf. 13:34). How and in what ways have you experienced the link between love of God and love of those around you?

He would not 'leave them orphans' but send an 'Advocate' to 'be with (them) for ever'. How have you experienced the presence of the Holy Spirit of God with you in your life?
- Perhaps you have also experienced the challenge of preparing another (a child, a friend) for a time when you would no longer be physically together. Recall how you gave the message of your ongoing support.
- 4. How have you experienced the presence and support of a loved one (parent, spouse, friend) when circumstances have separated you from them?

The Deep End - An Inside View:

'If you want somebody to understand what the major intellects of the world religions mean by God, you could do a great deal worse than introduce them to Anna.'

Archbishop of Canterbury Dr Rowan Williams is among the many fans of Mister God, This is Anna, the story of four-year-old Anna and her friendship with 16-year-old Fynn, the author. Anna's outpourings on life, science and God, or 'Mister God' as she calls him, have entranced readers for years, bursting as they do with joy, inquisitiveness and insight. During a discussion on 'Mister God' and the ways in which he is different from people, Anna concludes: 'So you see, Fynn, people can't talk about Mister God from the outside; you can only talk about Mister God from the inside of him.'

As an illustration of the mystery of God's presence with us, it goes a long way. It is this mystery that Jesus breaks down for his disciples in today's Gospel when he promises to send his Spirit to be with them: 'On that day you will understand that I am in my Father and you in me and I in you'. Four-year-old Anna seems to have a handle on this mystery.
