Arrangements for other Sacraments and Ceremonies:

Baptism: If you have a child for baptism contact Fr. Gallagher and a date and time for baptism will be organised.

Marriage: Most weddings for 2020 have been rearranged for 2021. Any weddings in church in 2021 will follow government capacity regulations.

First Communion: It is intended to celebrate this Sacrament on Saturday 26th September at 11.00am with First Confession on Thursday 17th September at 7.00pm.

Confession: In the short-term during summer months (weather permitting) Fr. Gallagher will be available for Confession in the graveyards on Saturdays from 5.30pm to 5.50pm in St. Patrick's Church and Sundays from 8.30am to 8.50am in Our Lady of the Wayside. Confession with social distancing and privacy in the church building is quite difficult to achieve, hopefully this will resume in near future.

Funerals: According to present regulations only 30 people are permitted in the church or cemetery at any one time.
Please note that as regulations change we will either extend or roll back on these arrangements

Public First Anniversary / Month's Mind Masses: During the coming weeks there will be several First Anniversaries masses celebrated in St. Patrick's Church. Several rows in the church will be set aside for family members and places will be available then on a first come, first served basis. If there is an overflow you are asked to return to your car and listen to the mass on the outdoor speakers. Please follow the direction of the ushers.

This Week's Calendar of Feasts and Saints:

Sunday 13th September – St. John Chrysostom (bishop and doctor of the Church) [347-407]

One of the four great Greek Doctors, and 'Golden-Mouthed preacher'. He was archbishop of Constantinople. He incurred much opposition and died in exile. Patron saint of preachers.

Tuesday 15th September – Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows Mary standing by the cross, "suffered intensely with her only begotten Son and united herself as his Mother to his sacrifice, consenting with love to the offering of the victim who was born of her," whom she also offered to the Eternal Father' *Marialis Cultus*

Wednesday 16th September – St. Cornelius (pope and martyr) Became Pope in 251 and died in exile at Civitavecchia in 253. Patron of cattle and domestic animals.

St. Cyprian (martyr) [210-258] Bishop of Carthage, teacher and preacher, martyr.

Thursday 17th September – St. Robert Bellarmine (bishop and doctor of the Church) [1542-1621]

Jesuit, Cardinal Bishop of Capua, involved in theological controversies of the time. Patron of catechists.

Saturday 19th September – St. Januarius (bishop and martyr) While no contemporary sources on his life are preserved, later sources and legends claim that he died during the Diocletianic Persecution, which ended with Diocletian's retirement in 305.
